

The Kelly Family Houseboat is back

Speyer. Since 2004, the Kelly Family houseboat has been an exhibit at the Technik Museum Speyer. After 18 years, the boat left the museum on Sunday 10 April. The reason for this was filming for a television documentary. From the museum grounds, Sean o'Kelley went by heavyduty transport to the Braun shipyard in Speyer and then back on to the Rhine.

As part of the RTL2 filming, the boat sailed to Amsterdam under its own power. The documentary accompanies the band on a journey through their past and visits the most important places of their career. Together with Joey and Jimmy Kelly, the museum team has been working on this project over the past few months. For four weeks, the exhibit was unavailable to visitors. But from 7 May, the houseboat will be on view again at its old place in the museum. Together with long-standing partners like the forwarding agency Kübler and the crane company Scholpp, the exhibit was returned overnight from 4-5 May.

"It is the first time in the history of the technology museum that a large exhibit has left a museum after such a long time then returned. When Joey Kelly told us about the project, it was immediately clear to us that we would support our friend and member of the museum friends association with the plan", explained press spokesperson Corinna Siegenthaler. Transporting the houseboat shows just how versatile the Technik Museum's friends association, with more than 3,500 members, is. Whether a collector, musician, technology fan or actor: anyone interested in the museum can become a member. The aim of the association is to preserve the technical and cultural assets for posterity and to promote interest in technical developments.
